To experience maximum benefits from these "Bible Boosters", they must be digested mentally, and then verbalized audibly and boldly with enthusiasm. When faith speaks, it is not timid or shy. A generous daily dose will drive away fear and cause the Devil to flee. Two of Satan's tools are "fear" and "torment." These Booster Shots have an eternal guarantee from God!

*"For as the rain comes down, and the snow from Heaven
And do not return there, but water the earth,
And makes it bring forth and bud,
That it may give seeds to the sower and bread to the eater,
So shall **my word** be that goes forth from **my mouth**,
It shall not return to me void
It **shall accomplish** what I please,

These "Bible Booster Shots" are based 100% on God's Word and on the biblical principle of "**confession**." To confess literally means to "say with "or to "say the same thing." Applied to Scripture it means to "**say the same thing God says about me**." There is a negative and positive side to confession. The negative side being those things I chose not to do or be any more. The positive side being those things that I desire to be and do. The negative side has to do with confessing our sins to God and turning away from them. The result is positive one:

- 1) - forgiveness of sins;
- 2) - cleansing of sins;
- 3) - penalty of sin canceled;
- 4) - guilt of sin removed;
- 5) - clean before God;
- 6) - justified - just as if I had never sinned;

The first and most important step is: I must agree with God "*All have sinned and fall short of the Glory of God.*" (Rom. 3:23). That includes me. But praise God! His word says, "*If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness*" (1 Jn 1:9). "*The cleansing agent is the blood of Jesus Christ*" (1 Jn. 1-7). The positive side of confession is to agree with God in **all** He says about the believer, His child, the "**New Creation**" in Christ Jesus (2 Cor. 5:17) As a child of God, my Father, I must be willing to submit to Him and His Word. If my attitude is right, and my heart is yielded to Him, I will pray with the Psalmist in Psalm 139:23-24:

*„Search me O God, and know my heart;
Try me, and know my anxieties;
And see if there is any wicked way in me,
And lead me the way everlasting."*

Once sin problem has been taken care of, the believer needs to learn to live with a "Righteousness Mentality" instead of a "Sin Mentality." For too many years, Christians have been more conscience of sin than of righteousness. E.W. Kenyon has written, "We the (preachers in the churches) have majored in sin-consciousness. We have preached the Law and kept our people under condemnation." Believers need to live with "Righteousness Mentality" because Jesus Christ is our **righteousness** from God.

*"But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became **for us** Wisdom from God - and Righteousness and sanctification and Redemption - that, as **it is written**, He who glories, let him glory in the Lord." (1 Cor. 1:30-31) "*For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that **we** might become the **righteousness of God in Him**."* (2 Cor. 5:21)*
